This week's word of the week is:

ACCEPTANCE

Imagine you have a box of crayons with many different colors. Each crayon is unique, just like people. Acceptance is like appreciating and enjoying all the colors in your box without thinking that one color is better than another.

So, acceptance for people means liking and respecting everyone for who they are, even if they're different from us.

The Friday morning assembly was based on LGBT+ History Month, which is an annual celebration and remembrance of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender history. One of the focus points for this assembly was the story of Alan Turing's legacy. The legacy of Alan Turing's life and

work did not fully come to light long after his death in 1954. It wasn't until the 1990s that his role in cracking the Enigma code in the Second World War came to light. In 1939 he took up a full-time role at Bletchley Park - where secret work was carried out to decipher the military codes used by Germany and its allies. In the early 1950's Turing was arrested for homosexuality - which was then illegal in Britain - and was found guilty of 'gross indecency'.

In 2016 the Government announced gay and bisexual men convicted of now-abolished sexual offences in England and Wales were to receive posthumous pardons under an amendment dubbed the "Turing law".
