In Food Tech this week we are starting our worldwide tour! This week students have cooked dishes from the USA, Spain and Italy!

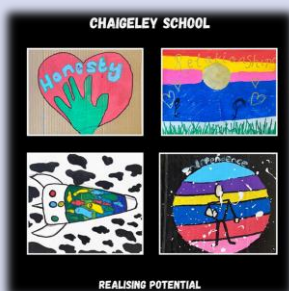
### Art Class
